Pastor's Article...

The following is an Christmas Parable. It doesn't use the scenes of the season to warm our hearts, but it does begin to explain why we celebrate the gift of a baby in a manger. It is an adaption of "A Parable of a King and a Maiden" by Soren Kierkegaard, Philosophical Fragments (ch. 2).

Suppose there was a king who loved a humble maiden. This king was like no other king. Every statesman trembled before his power. No one dared breathe a word against him, for he had the strength to crush all opponents.



And yet this mighty king was melted by love for a humble maiden who lived in a poor village in his kingdom. How could he declare his love for her? In an odd sort of way, his kingliness tied his hands. If he brought her to the palace and crowned her head with jewels and clothed her body in royal robes, she would surely not resist-no one dared resist him. She might even live forever in gratitude to his largesse. But would she love him?

She would say she loved him, of course, but would she truly? Or would she live with him in the fear of losing everything she had gained, nursing a private grief for the poor but consistent life she had left behind? Would she be happy at his side? How could he know for sure? If he rode to her forest cottage in his royal carriage, with an armed escort waving bright banners, that too would overwhelm her. He did not want a cringing subject. He wanted a lover, an equal. He wanted her to forget that he was a king and she a humble maiden and to let shared love cross the gulf between them. For it is only in love that the unequal can be made equal.



Youth Group Service Blitz lock-in November - 18th & 19th

Thirteen youth participated throughout the day in various service projects. We had hoped to help clear brush at Bev & Jerry Welch's house, but the weather did not cooperate. Instead, we cleaned classrooms at church! Below are the projects we accomplished:

- 1. Youth served alongside adults at the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan, sorting vegetables, dairy products including eggs, and breads and sweets. The three boys did a fantastic job of bringing out pallets of food, removing them after being sorted, wrapping, weighing and marking each pallet, and then returning the pallet to the storage area. The girls and adults sorted and re-boxed all the items. With all hands on deck, we finished early and had a lot of fun!
- 2. Youth cleaned and organized all toys in the nursery and preschool rooms. This included dunking smaller toys in bleach water, wiping down all bigger toys and furniture, cleaning out all storage bins, and cleaning the floor mat under the loft unit in the preschool room. They also began sorting craft items in the art room.
- 3. Youth packaged 107 bags of feminine products for the Faith & Femininity mission. Each bag con sisted of 14 tampons, 14 pads, 7 pantyliners, symptoms of toxic shock, and a scripture verse. We will be placing another order for feminine products with the \$450 still on hand, and will be having another packing night sometime in December. The bags are being delivered to Carriage Town Ministries.

The different verses Lindsey and Waverly chose are listed below:

Psalms 46:5 God is with her, she will not fall.

Proverbs 31:25 She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs without fear of the future.

Philippians 4:6-8 Don't worry about anything, instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank Him for all He has done.

Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord. "Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."





"Safe Dates" Update: Thirty-two youth and adults participated in the program, learning the importance of expecting respect through healthy dating. Pastors Lindsey and Robbie, and Tina Ritchie are inviting everyone to continue the conversation on Friday, December 15th from 6-8pm in Fellowship Hall. Dinner will be provided – please RSVP on the

We will be discussing God's desires for our relationships, components and development of healthy relationship habits, and offering communication strategies. Worship During Advent This article is based on worship resources created by Clayton Libolt

Throughout the Advent season the sermons will focus on God being among us. We do not worship a God who chooses to stay far from us. God has consistently called people to be near and know him. We find this in the Old Testament, all throughout the New and especially in the person of Jesus Christ. The following are some helpful thoughts and Scripture readings to help you prepare for worship.

December 3rd: When Heaven Walked the Earth - Scripture: Genesis 3:1-9 Imagine a starlit night. In the distant horizon, you see the farthest object that one can see with the naked eye: the Andromeda galaxy. The immensity of the night sky overwhelms you. Tears begin rolling down your cheeks. A great loneliness seizes you, a pain in the center of your being. The Bible suggests that this loneliness comes from a sense that things that belonged together have gotten separated; an original unity has come apart. This is the story of that separation. What has come apart are earth and heaven. Originally they were one. God walked in the garden in the cool of the day. What was once one has become two. But here's the good news, the great truth of the Bible: God longs for Eden, for the original unity, as much as we do. Advent is about reawakening this longing within us, the longing for Immanuel, God-with-us.

December 10th: When Heaven Came Back - Scripture: Luke 1:26-38; 46-55
Suppose you grew up in a nice house in a nice neighborhood—a warm, welcoming, and orderly place. Years later you return to the house. Your family is still there, but something terrible has happened. Instead of order, you find chaos. Garbage is heaped up in the corners of the rooms. Nothing in the house seems to work. Those who live there are sullen and nasty to each other. Something like this has happened to the human race. We started out in a lush garden, but now we live in a disorderly, dysfunctional world. We find garbage heaped in the corners. Violence is rampant. We are tempted to sing, "This world is not my home." But indeed it is. And we need someone to set it right. One day the Prince slips in, incognito, or nearly so. For the most part, the world fails to recognize him, but those who have been trained to see the clues find him. Mary is one such person, but because the Prince still walks among us, we too can see him, if only we know where to look. So where do we look? Mary's song is full of clues. Look among the poor, among those who have little, among those who suffer. In Advent we redirect our sight from the illusions that cover up the sad truth of the human race to the places and people among whom the Prince walks, and for whom the Prince has come.

December 17th: When Heaven Came to Us - Scripture: Colossians 2:6-12, 16-3:4
In her book Take This Bread, Sara Miles encounters the mystery of the sacrament. Wandering into a worship service at St. Gregory's in San Francisco, she is moved to come forward. Someone puts bread in her mouth, and, as she puts it, "Jesus happened to me." The sacrament is one of the ways that Jesus gets inside us. Once Jesus is inside us, his story becomes our story. We find a new identity, both our own and Christ's. The peril here, as Paul reminds us in Colossians 2, is religion. Religion tries to make us conformists. Life in Jesus allows us to become what we are. Colossians 3 says that Jesus is the person who knows who we originally were and, underneath it all, still are. This identity is hidden in heaven, but even now, in Christ, we begin to recall it and live it anew. In this way, heaven comes to dwell in us. We become the community of those for whom the unity of heaven and earth has been restored, even if the restoration is still agonizingly partial.

December 24th: When Heaven Comes to Stay - Scripture: Revelation 21:1-5
This climatic passage in the book of Revelation tells us of what might be called the "greater Christmas": the final coming together of earth and heaven. The New Jerusalem descends. God takes up residence among us. All, at last, is restored. This is set against the backdrop of the destruction of the old world order. In a surprisingly contemporary note, the merchants of the earth watch as the great Babylon, consumer of the world's goods, goes up in flames. "In one hour such great wealth has been brought to ruin!" (Rev. 18:17). But as chapter 19 makes clear, this wealth has been built on violence. When the whole structure comes tumbling down, and death and Hades are themselves thrown into the lake of fire, the earth greens in preparation for the restoration of heaven to earth. For now, that means that there is a sharp divide between those who belong to Babylon—the current world order—and those who long for the coming of this greater Christmas. Which are you?
