PASTOR'S LETTER

Rediscovering Joy

Psalm 126:3 "The Lord has done great things for us and we are filled with joy"

In Luke 1:14, Zechariah, an elderly priest, is told by the angel of the Lord, that his wife(also up in years), will have a child and that they will have joy and be glad. Even as Zechariah stood face to face with the angel telling him that he will have joy, he doubts. As Christians, having no angel to back up claims of joy and gladness on the horizon, we can sometimes find ourselves like Zechariah struggling to remain buoyant in these choppy seas.

Christmas should be a season of joy. Not just the circumstantial happiness that comes with festivities, friends and family, but a deep abiding joy as we remember the birth of Jesus. For many of us these days, joy can be something that we have a memory of, but can't seem to grasp right now. This year hangs on us like a weight. Joy is like a weak muscle, withered from lack of use. How can we rediscover Joy?

Let us remember that real, unadulterated, lasting joy comes from Jesus. Every other source simply does not have the octane to power us through the high waters we can sometimes go through. When we find ourselves unable to grasp joy, we need to turn our attention to the source of real joy. As we learn more about who God is we find ourselves able to rejoice more and more.

Joy is meant to be shared. Depression and sadness are inherently isolating. Unworking this kind of darkness in our lives requires sharing life with others. Even as we are unable to gather in significant numbers, intentional personal connection with people, be it over Zoom, Facetime or a pen pal exchange gives us an avenue to share the joy we have in Christ. We help each other keep our candles light in the darkness.

As we experience God's joy and share it with each other we find our world begins to expand. We begin to see clearly God's fingerprint on creation, on other people in our world and our circumstances themselves. Joy begins to surprise us in everyday things. In a sense, Joy is a light in our souls, that when kindled and nurtured, can warm and illuminate the world around us.

In times like these, it can take a lot of work to find joy. We will always find it worth the effort as we refine the art of joyfulness. Don't give up learning more and more about who God is through study and personal devotion. Do something intentional to connect with the people you love. And allow your world to be expanded as you see more and more how God sees the world and is using you to redeem it.

Merry Christmas! And may the God of all hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Roman 15:13).



There are 25 chapters, to be read one per day for Advent, and each chapter is only 5-8 pages. Each chapter highlights a different story from the Old Testament, culminating in the birth of Christ. 




