# PASTOR'S LETTER The Need To Party

For many of us COVID has produced a deep seated need to be with people. Much of this is because we have not been able to gather in groups like we have in the past, and even when we do gather with family members or friends, even in small numbers, there is an insidious fear that we might be unintentionally prolonging the pandemic and passing on the virus. Even for those of us who have maintained skepticism about the pandemic and have tried to maintain normal patterns throughout this past year have been effected by the drastic reorientation of how we gather together and socialize.

As we look forward to restrictions being lifted and the pandemic ceasing, the general tone of our society is how to restart our social lives. Open houses for graduates, camping trips, graduation celebrations, and baseball games are all being planned. This is a great sign of things getting back to normal.

#### As I think about what normal is, I have some doubts about whether we should settle for that.

While I imagine that extroverts withered in the pandemic relational famine, being a self-proclaimed introvert, I didn't mind so much. But the pandemic season of isolation was crippling to me. This is because whether you are extroverted or introverted, everyone needs authentic relationships. The pandemic removed our normal social rhythms that gave us a structure to develop the kind of relationships that really have meaningthe kind we all really need. For many of us this past year has forced us to be intentional about developing relationships or miss out on them.

# What if we kept being intentional about maintaining and creating new relationships even after the pandemic ends?

One thing that my family has done for the past year is to set aside Sunday night for a zoom call. Four households from across the country meet and chat for about an hour. While this may sound normal to you, it took a 100 year pandemic to get the Carnes family to carve that rhythm out of each week. We have never done that before and it is a beautiful thing. New babies were introduced, celebrations were shared, sorrow was mutually born; all because we had to be intentional about meeting or it wouldn't happen.

Before you start scheduling zoom calls, I want to express to you the kind of relationship that I'm talking about. Simply spending time with each other isn't a meaningful relationship. It's certainly fertile ground for relationships, but we have all had kids on the track team, enjoyed the track parents, and as soon as the season is over we loose contact and move on. In the off chance that a real friendship develops that can be defined beyond the specific rhythm of the track season, that is what we can develop into a meaningful relationship. And, of course, it is those meaningful relationships that extroverts and introverts really need, pandemic or not.

family zoom calls are deeply My meaningful because the people I am relating to remind me who I am (they have intimate knowledge of all of the stupid stuff I have ever done), we share our life goals with each other, and keep each other accountable, sharing joys and bearing sorrow. Beyond simply being with people, what feeds our hearts is being in relationships with others in which we are known and we can share our stories as we live life together. Beyond an individual's need to socialize, authentic relationships create living giving community that nurtures its members and grows beyond mere acquaintance into a Spiritual Family. A Spiritual Family has a Spiritual Father and I am blessed that those Sunday zoom calls not only serve to draw us closer to each other, but closer to God. This, of course, is the ultimate result of real relationships; addressing not just emotional needs, but spiritual realities as well.

It feels strange, as an introvert, to feel the need to host parties and spend time with people. It might be that this past year has revealed a new need for balance in my social life. In Luke 10:38-42 we read the familiar story of the sisters Mary and Martha. Martha is busy with the details of hosting and gets upset with Mary who is intent and content with spending time with Jesus. While it can be helpful to recognize our personal tendencies toward either Martha or Mary, it is crucial to recognize that we need both. We need Martha, who is intentional about creating the environment for relationships to happen, and we need Mary, who is intentional about nurturing connections with others and ultimately connecting to Jesus. In this season of renewed openness, don't neglect the need to gather together in any safe and responsible way that you can. As you make your party plans, don't neglect the need for all of us to have authentic, nurturing, and deep relationships as well. Be open to how Jesus will enter in and don't hesitate to journey with each other in the presence of the Holy Spirit. It is in the well planned out garden that Martha plants that we see the precious fruit of Mary's intentional community.

### June Sermon Series

Discipleship is a lifestyle not a program. It is something we are and not just do. Or worse, just talk about it! Discipleship is what happens when we embrace who we are in Christ and step out in obedience by the power of the Holy Spirit. When we witness the Spirit in our personal lives it manifests in specific ways within the Family of God. This month we will be talking about Walking in Obedience, Sharing the Wealth, and Resting Well. Specifically on how the Church body calls each member to a gospel oriented life. We also are welcoming Pastor Isaac Chung on June 6th. He will be speaking on his calling to be a missionary to Tajikistan. As a Spiritual Family, the Holy Spirit works to send some out to be emissaries of the Kingdom of God. As the Holy Spirit works in our Spiritual Family, we recognize more and more the ministry gifts of others and the need for people of hear of God's love for them.



# A NOTE FROM SESSION

#### Dear FFPC Friends,

The Session of FFPC has met to discuss the ever improving information about and changing restrictions surrounding COVID 19. At the most recent Session meeting the following was decided:

1. Beginning June 1st, FFPC will adopt the position that masks are optional for the majority of the use of the Church Building and Church events. Paper masks will remain available for those who might need one and handwashing stations will remain available throughout the building.

2. As Christ's body we will treat everyone with the same love, respect and compassion that we receive from Christ. This means that all of us will be diligent in maintaining our personal welfare and be considerate of the health and welfare of each other. Let us practice love for each other as some may wear masks and others may not. Let us extend every grace to be considerate as we all will have different comfortabilities with social distance and physical contact such as hugging, hand shaking and sitting closely together.

3. The various groups that wish to meet in the Church building are welcome to do so. With the support of the Session and Church staff each of these groups (Knitting Group, Deacons Boards, Chancel Choir, etc...) should establish specific agreements surrounding masks and social distancing with the goal of promoting the peace and unity of the church.

Colossians 3: 12 As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. 13 Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. 14 Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. 15 And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. 17 And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.



It hasn't been quite a month since my last report, but I have another request for donations already! It is exciting to see arrivals begin to pick up! This year we have already delivered items to 4 families. Most recently, I asked for help to find things for a man, Sameer, who had recently arrived from Iraq, and your response was incredible!



The delivery to Sameer went very well. He was very grateful for the help. We are keeping in contact as he is likely to move again once he is able to find work. We may need a bed and a few other items for him soon. Along with two dressers and a dining table, we brought dishes, glasses, silverware, kitchen utensils, bedding, and lamps. Here is a photo of the items and above one of Sameer with Robbie. Thank you all who were able to help with this effort!

We are currently arranging our 5th delivery of the year. A changing table, high chair, and pack and play will go to Angie and Jonatan, a Columbian couple in Detroit who are expecting a baby. We have previously brought them other items and are happy to help welcome an addition to their family!

This week I was contacted by Samaritas to see if we could help a family arriving later this week. This family is coming to Michigan from Egypt where they have been waiting for a permanent placement after fleeing their home in Syria. Their travel plans have been cancelled several times over the past year, so Samaritas is really excited to see them finally arrive. The family of four consists of Mom, Dad, and two young sons (ages 1 and 5). They are in need of a crib, a full or queen sized bed for mom and dad, a changing table, and dressers. If we are able to secure any of these items, they will be delivered as soon as possible.

### World of Wonder Mission Opportunities




### Building Fund Report - April 30th, 2021




