

PASTOR'S LETTER

Why

Pastor Robbie Carnes

Why.

"He who has a why to live can bear almost any how." Friedrich Nietzsche

This quote has a very practical ring to it. All of us can look back at times in which we have accomplished things that we never thought possible because of an innate drive. We had a reason to persevere and purpose that sustained us. It may have been starting a business or completing a college degree. It could have been raising a child or maintaining 50 years of marriage. The 'whys' of our life can make molehills of the mountainous 'hows'.

When Jesus is asked by the Pharisees, "What is the greatest commandment (Matthew 22:34)?" Jesus replies in a remarkable way. Combining two important summaries of Torah, Jesus offers to the Pharisees a tremendous 'why' for their faith.

37 He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38 This is the greatest and first commandment. 39 And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' 40 On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

One commentary suggested that this was the moment in which Jesus ensured his condemnation by the religious leaders. Not because Jesus did anything contrary to the law, but that Jesus presented a purpose, a 'why', that transformed their 'hows'. The part about loving God was a piece of the basic confession of the Jewish Faith. Deuteronomy 6, "Hear O Israel, The Lord is our God, the Lord alone." If Jesus had simply left it at this, the

Pharisees would have been pleased. They were happy with their why. It was safe for them and they had created an entire system of belief and practice in order to make sure they complied. They were commanded to Love the Lord because, the Lord is lovely, worthy, majestic and almighty.

But Jesus didn't leave it at that.

Jesus presented something more nuanced than an individual worshiping identity. There is a purpose to that worship—a reason for the ritual. Jesus includes a mission identity. We are to love the Lord so that we might love our neighbor. It follows that we should love our neighbor because we love the Lord.

Jesus is connecting the 'hows' of worship and mission with the 'whys' of relationship. We worship Jesus, learn more about his words and ways, and we engage together as a church family to go about doing Jesus' works. All this has the revolving purpose of building relationships with God and others so that we can serve, and serving God and others so that we might be in right relationship with God and others.

God is calling all of us into a close relationship in which we might know the one who created us and be known as a beloved child. It is this love that is properly lived out when we go out on mission to extend the boundaries of God's kingdom of love into the lives of others. We do this by relating to others [and to God] in love and service. The 'hows' of our faith are underwritten by powerful 'whys'. We are beloved people sent out to share that love. How does this 'why' change things for you?

Samaritas Update

August of 2021 has been an incredible month for our refugee ministry. I am excited to tell you that we delivered furniture and home goods to six families this month! That brings our total for 2021 to 15! We have now accomplished our goal of delivering to one family each month. I will have to reevaluate the end of year goal. First I will share a little about our deliveries...

This month's deliveries took us to Dearborn, Detroit, Sterling Heights, and Clinton Township. The first two families live on the same street in Detroit. They needed a few items to round out their new households. We brought them a bookcase, booster seats, bed linens, vacuum cleaners, a tool kit, several throw blankets, sets of towels, a dresser, a television with digital antenna, and a floor lamp. The booster seats are especially appreciated as it allows young children to be transported to their many initial appointments by Samaritas volunteers.

The next two families were in Dearborn. Two volunteers brought them a trailer and a truck full of furniture and goods. Included were home office supplies, a buffet with hutch, glasses, vacuum cleaners, bookcases, a dining table and 6 chairs, 3 dressers, lamps, an air conditioner, and bed linens.

The final deliveries went to Sterling Heights and Clinton Township; both of the families are originally from Iraq and have been in Michigan for about one month. I was greeted at the first apartment by a happy pet bird named Lulu, and by two toddlers at the second apartment who seemed very excited to open the boxes that were being delivered. The highlights of these deliveries were a roll-away bed and a bed frame. Both were received with excitement and gratitude. Sleeping in a bed instead of on the floor can be such a huge boost to morale!

Now I would like to share our current needs. We still have a good stock of items, but are running low on dressers, towels, booster seats, and silverware. I am also hoping to find someone who would like to make "Welcome to Michigan" cards. It is nice to be able to give the families a card that tells them who we are, and I'm sure there are some card makers who could do this much better than I! Let me know if this is your talent and I can give you more details. And of course, we are always looking to expand our delivery team. If you would like to help make deliveries please let me know. More trucks and drivers = more impact for our group.

As I am sure you are aware, the humanitarian crisis in Afghanistan is likely to bring many more refugees to Michigan. Our partner organization, Samaritas, is looking for community partners to work with as they prepare to receive refugees from Afghanistan. We have agreed to be a co-sponsoring organization, and now we have some time to decide what that will look like. There is a list of tasks/volunteer jobs that we can consider and choose from to define our role. We have scheduled a meeting for September 8th from 7pm-8pm to discuss what resources we think we have to offer and where our group would best fit into the resettlement process. To be sure, this will be a longer term project. The process of resettling as a refugee usually involves at least a 2 year vetting process. Although that might be shortened for Afghans, the initial arrivals will likely not be until next year or later.



Tuesday Morning Study using Charles Barclay's <u>Acts of the Apostles</u> Beginng September 14th

Acts is the story of God's grace flooding out into the world. The book of Acts is an historical account of how the resurrection of Jesus changes everything. Luke records the early days of the church after Jesus' ascension and how, still today, the gospel of grace draws them in, constitutes them as a church centered on the grace of Jesus, and them sends them out in mission to the world. Each week we'll take a few sections of the study and you are invited to read ahead or just come and read and discuss it together.



Women's Covenant Groups – Breaking Free by Beth Moore

Discover the freedom available to you from the transforming power of Christ. Based on Isaiah 61:1-4, this in-depth Bible study draws parallels between the Israelites in captivity and believers in spiritual captivity. Beth uses Scripture to help identify spiritual strongholds in your life and explains that anything that hinders you from the benefits of knowing God is bondage. First released in 1999, this updated version includes 11 new video teaching messages along with reedited Bible study content and testimonies of how women like you have been delivered from their personal captivity.

Dear Families,

Back-to-school is upon us, and for your family, this year may be filled with more uncertainty than the last. Whether your kids are attending school in person or learning from home, the books below from our friends at <u>Beamingbooks.com</u>. Encourage kids to continue to learn, grow, and ask questions. Also, ask your children about their glads and sads, highs and lows each day, and be sure to share yours with them too. Include these thoughts in dinner time and bedtime prayers, and begin each day with a prayer of thanks and encouragement to find joy and make good choices. Establishing a routine of talking with God throughout the day helps children begin to understand who God is, that they are loved, and never alone, even when they might feel like they are. Please let me know how I can best support you and your family during each phase of faith exploration and development! May God's guiding Grace, Wisdom, and patience be upon you.

1. Ask Challenging Questions: Kids ask so many questions. *In The Girl with Big.* Big Ouestions, question after question bubbles out from one little girl with twinkling eyes and a curious mind. When the girl finds that her big questions make some people uncomfortable, she stops asking. But then she learns that her questions can solve problems and that asking questions is how we learn and grow. Celebrate the spirit of curiosity and the joy of learning with this lively picture

book about a persistent girl and her quest for knowledge.



2. Learn a New Language: Bella has talented siblings, but she isn't sure what she is good at herself. When she decides to learn how to bake with her wise old abuela, her first attempt at dulce de leche frosting looks like scaly cocodrilo skin. She must learn it's okay to try again. Peppered with Spanish vocabulary, Bella's Recipe for Success will show all kids the value of practicing to learn a new skill, and that it's okay to make mistakes along the way. Books are a great way to ease

kids into learning a new language. <u>Download these flashcards</u> to help kids practice the Spanish from the book.



3. **Be a Trailblazer:** Puritan women in the 1600s weren't allowed to be writers. PLGRIM, But when the world learned about Anne Dudley Bradstreet's poetry, composed by candlelight when her children were asleep, even she was astonished by what happened next. Charmingly illustrated, Poet, Pilgrim, Rebel tells the inspiring story of how a Puritan woman overcame the obstacles facing women of her era

to become one of the most famous poets in history. Download the free Poet, Pilgrim, Rebel Educator's Guide for kids to continue learning about Anne Bradstreet and her writing.

4. **Back-to-School Resources for Kids:** This back-to-school season is filled with uncertainty. Our list of back-to-school resources includes the books highlighted above and many more to help us all prepare for the days ahead, covering topics like curiosity, mindfulness, inspiring historical figures, and everything in between.
