# PASTOR'S LETTER

# Walking with Jesus

In Luke 14:23 Jesus shares a story about a man giving a dinner party. He tells his servants, "Go out into the roads and lanes, and compel people to come in, so that my house may be filled." While allegorical, this resonates with Jesus' commands to his disciples (and us) to proclaim the Gospel to the world, to baptize and to teach, and to tell others about him.

Many times this feels like the missing leg of my three legged faith. I am inspired to worship and serve God, especially with my congregation. I enjoy being with people who love Jesus and I learn so much from being with faithful disciples. However, I don't feel very successful at proclaiming the Gospel on a personal level. Sometimes I feel like I have tapped out all the appropriate avenues to share God's love. I know that I miss out on many opportunities.

This month I am going to challenge myself to try the following things in order to stretch myself to share the Gospel more. I got these ideas from a Blog by Paul Macaonochie.

1) Find value in Prayer. We live in a world of efficiency. Constantly we press ourselves to produce, answering emails, sending texts, serving, accomplishing, traveling. Yet this might not be so effective when it comes to spiritual things. In Acts 6 the Apostles raise up 7 leaders to handle administrative tasks so that the disciples can pray more! If we are to communicate spiritual truth we need to pray for the Holy Spirit. How can we expect the Holy Spirit to fill us unless we ask the Holy Spirit? How do we expect to know

the mind of God unless we take time to ask him? Praying is the foundation to sharing. How can you dedicate more time in a day to prayer?


2) Find third spaces. This is a social science term that refers to public places that are not our homes nor our work places, in which we find significant community. When I worked at Starbucks we were encouraged to think of our custumers as our community and, therefore, make our coffee shop a third space for everyone who came in. Do you have a third space? A place that isn't your home or work, that you feel like a part of the community? This could be a favorite restaurant, bar, or coffee shop. It could be a community organization. It should be a place where you can intentionally expose yourself to new people. Jesus speaking to the woman at the well in John 4, Bartimaeus receiving his sight (Mark 10) and the Ethiopian Eunuch (Acts 8) are all biblical examples of choosing to be in places where other people are who may be open. We could call them chance encounters or we could faithfully consider them movements of the Holy Spirit.

#### 3) Intentional extended family community.

In what ways do you try to connect with other disciples who are trying to follow Jesus? How are you seeking to grow spiritually with other people? Do you have spiritual mentors whom you seek out to challenge you? This might be the hardest thing on this list because it demands us to change our schedules and allocate time. It also calls us to humble ourselves and be willing to learn from

others. Jesus always sent his disicples out in groups and so we shouldn't try to do it alone.

Whether we are parents of small children or a retired petitioner, these are simple things that we can try on and see how Jesus works in our lives. Finding love and acceptance in the Father through Jesus, we are compelled to walk in Jesus' ways, speak Jesus' words, and seek Jesus' will. What is the next step for you in your walk with Jesus?


Fenton Farmer's Market Community Outreach Table Volunteer



The prophets also revealed God's power, love, and faithfulness to God's people. God reminded God's people of God's plan to send a Rescuer, Jesus, to take away their sin.


**Big Picture Question:** How many gods are there? There is one true God who alone deserves worship.

Have you taken a moment to visit our new libraries in the Grace and Truth rooms downstairs?


Did you know 60 new children's books have been purchased for the Youth Library located in the Truth Room?

Educating and enlightening curious growing minds, these books have been chosen to invite youth into the mystery of knowing the One who created and loves them, and who calls each of us to love others. One of those books is God's Holy Darkness. Below is taken from the book's "Note for Caregivers." Please take time to ponder its message.

"In our world and in our lives, Blackness should be celebrated. Darkness should foster wonder and awe. And we should find comfort and rest in the night. But instead, we usher in light/dark binaries. Look to John 1:5: "The light shall shine in the darkness and the darkness shall not overcome it." This passage speaks of literal lightness and darkness, but we have ascribed qualities of "good" versus "bad" to light and darkness, with light being "good" and dark being "bad." With the construct of race, these attributes were given to people with light-colored skin (white) and people with dark-colored skin (black and brown). But we are called, and always have been called, to disrupt this binary thinking and, ultimately, disrupt and dismantle the systems that value lightness over darkness, Whiteness over Blackness.

God's Holy Darkness features beloved Bible stories. Sometimes, we know stories so well we forget to listen to them. This book challenges us to hear those stories in a new way. To hear the stories of the beauty and holiness and goodness of Blackness and darkness and night. Read these words and ask questions. What other ways can we challenge our perceptions of race in church and theology? When you imagine God, Jesus, or other biblical figures, what do they look like? What images have you seen? What images are hung in church buildings? Look, and listen, at what is there. Look, and listen, for what is missing. Seek comfort and rest at night, wonder at the mystery of the dark, celebrate Blackness. Disrupt the binary and welcome God's Holy Darkness."
