CALL TO CONFESSION *From 2 Timothy 1:1–14*

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (In Unison)

You call us to maintain the unity of spirit in the bond of peace, but we choose division over diversity, confrontation over civility, conflict over peace born from justice. You call us to love the least of these among us, but we hear the cries of the oppressed and choose our own comfort.

Rekindle in us your gifts — the spirit of power, love and self-discipline —that with faith in Christ, we might be made new and be part of bringing forth your peaceable kingdom.
