PASTOR'S LETTER

The Gift of Love

A book that I read recently, *“Good and Beautiful and Kind: Becoming Whole in a Fractured World”*, by Rich Villodas, is one I would recommend to you all. It speaks about how we all have a deep sense of loss for that which is good and beautiful and kind in our world. This is especially evident in the current political culture that has divided community and severed families and friends. Villodas presents some healthy insights into making peace; in our own hearts and in the world.

This is ringing loud and clear as we look toward the Christmas season and hear the Angel's call, “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!” (Luke 2:14)

The first point of Villodas' book is about the nature of sin. He profoundly defines it as a ‘failure to love’. The lack of sin requires the presence of love. The One who is ever-loving cannot stop loving because that One, God, is incapable of sin. This is the reason for Jesus being born; it's an act of love. It had to be done not simply because it was a fulfillment of prophecy, but because it was the marvelous conclusion of the reality of God's love for the world (John 3:16).

Love is required to be an action if it is to embody the fullness of the meaning of the word. It is marvelous to know that God's expression of love is to come near to us in Jesus (John 1:14). This is especially breathtaking when we see God's love in the face of our failure of love, that is, our sin. God is doing what we are not and cannot do.

The second point Villodas makes is that in order to contribute to the creation of a good, beautiful and kind world, we need to take steps to become good, beautiful and kind ourselves. If sin is the failure to love no amount of ethical training, salon weekends and paying it forward is going to leave a mark on our Teflon-sin hearts. The transformative work is that of contemplative prayer. You might wonder if this kind of prayer could ever make the world better. You may also wonder how a baby born into obscurity could change the world as well.

The point is that we are changed and that through the transformation of ourselves, we might be catalysts for transformation in the world. **This change is one of self-identity rather than self-improvement. It is knowing who you are and what you are supposed to be doing.** Therefore, we can be kind because we have had kindness shown to us. We can be beautiful because we have seen the author of beauty. And we can be good because we operate not through our own power, but that of the Holy Spirit.

We can be apart of God's family because God sent his son to prepare the way.

Lastly, Villodas shares practical ways we can work toward the transformation of the world. He has three suggestions. The first is that we need to learn how to have good conflict with others. If there are more than two people, conflict is a given. How do you have conflict and remain present with another person? This question has as many answers as there

are people; however, God in Jesus is an example. God, the ever-loving one, sent his Son to be born and live and teach and die among those who could not help but fail to love. Even when we aren't doing what we shouldn't, we don't do what we should. Yet, God chose to be among us. Healthy conflict means that we stay as present with each other as we can. (Please note that this does not suggest that anyone should or deserves to be abused mentally, physically, emotionally or otherwise).

The second practical idea is what Villodas calls the gift of forgiveness. It is easy to offend or be offended and forgiveness should be our go to answer. (I am not referring to harmful offense (like abuse) which may take longer to forgive and has much bigger facets to consider). Offense is that which can strike our pride and injure our sense of self. However, if we know ourselves to be apart of God's family, how can we truly be offended (Romans 8:37-39)? Therefore forgiveness, granted in order to break the cycle of offense and

remain present with each other, is our best action to embody goodness, beauty and kindness.

Lastly, love must be done in a public way. Loving action is more complete than loving words alone. Just like a young man who has found the girl of his dreams rushes her to meet his parents, love cannot be fully love if it is not shown to the world. God could not love the world unless Jesus was born as a baby. God's words of love through the prophets mean nothing unless God actually showed up. This season of Advent, as we wait in expectation, consider how you might transform your loving words into loving actions as well. God's love was incarnated, made flesh in Jesus. How might your love toward your spouse, your family, your neighbors and strangers be incarnated? May your Advent and Christmas season be good, beautiful, and kind because God, in Jesus and through the Holy Spirit, has shown himself to be good, beautiful, and kind



Christmas has become the biggest holiday in North America, arguably the biggest in the world and in many ways, it has become a holiday of "more": more presents, more stuff, more events, more expectations, more stress. But as it turns out, if we dial back the "more," we get closer to the heart of Advent and Christmas. For the stories of the season all point in a "less is more"



So this year, let's get back to basics. Let's recapture the beauty of simplicity. Let's have music and presents and celebration, yes, but let's focus on what's most important, and put rest things rest. This year, let's have less stuff and less stress and more hope, more peace, more joy, and more love.

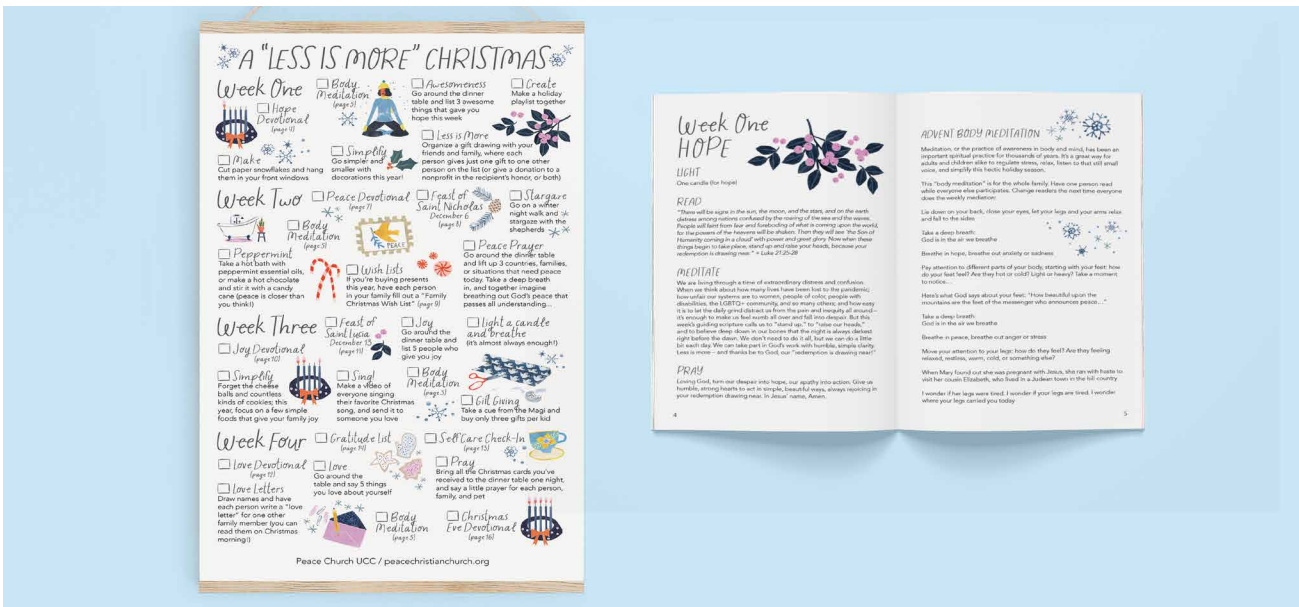

Do not invoke the names of other gods; do not let them be heard on your lips.”

The Worship Committee has decided to do something new with the Advent Devotional in 2022. For many years we have solicited daily devotions from the congregation and have benefited from each’s reflections on the season and on God’s goodness to us. This year we are feeling the need to ‘rest and lie fallow’. Therefore, using the theme “Less is More”, we are engaging together in a different kind of devotional.

There are two parts. The first is a booklet that guides you through each week of Advent with different meditations and thoughts for the week. Your household is invited to use the traditional advent candles and wreath to create a moment of reflection and holy conversation. If you live alone, consider joining with another household or other individuals to make the experience more rich.

The second part is a poster that offers simple daily activities designed to encourage being present in the moment. Think of it as daily challenges to focus your heart on the incarnation of God and to be present to God’s salvation in our lives.

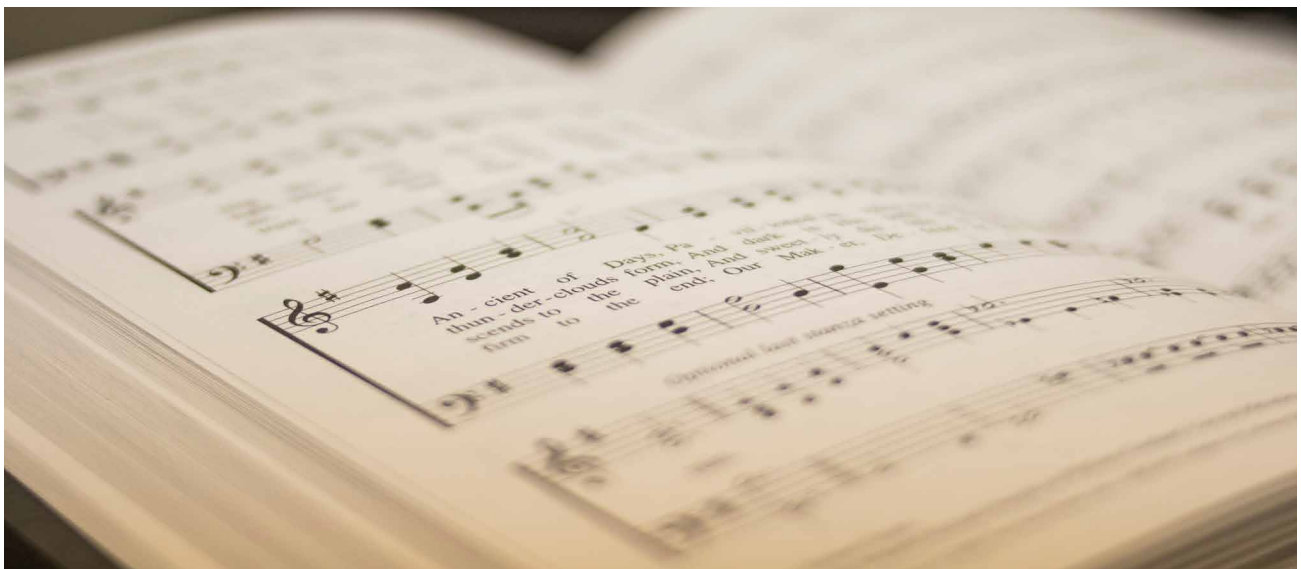

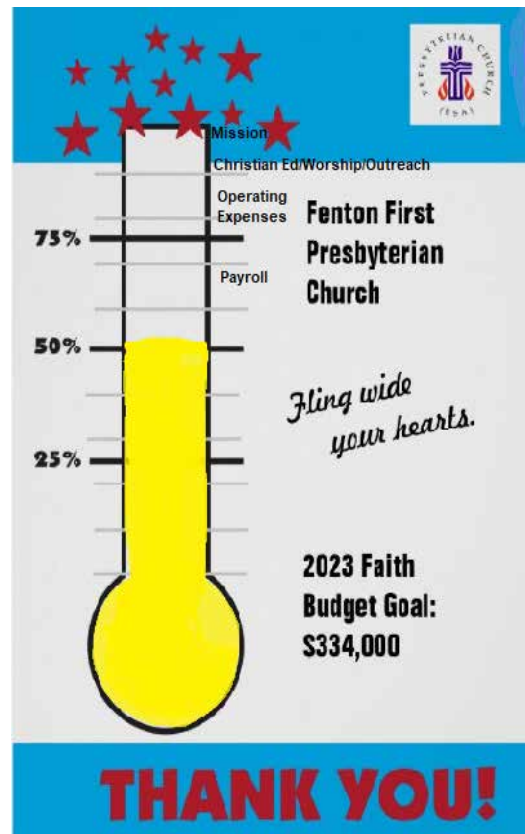

Samaritas Update

We have 3 new Samaritas matches. Below I will give brief descriptions of our matches and a list of our current needs.

Family 1 is a family of four from Iran. They have been here one month and recently moved into their first home in Dearborn. We were going to make a delivery to them in December, but then I found out yesterday that they are sleeping on the floor of their rental house. Thanks to some very dedicated volunteers beds were located and delivered.

Family 2 is a family of 3 from Afghanistan. This family also needs a good amount of furniture. We are coordinating with Sayna to assess their needs as there is a language barrier. I am looking for volunteers to make a delivery to this family sometime near the end of November.

Family 3 is a family of 2, soon to be 3. They need a crib and some baby items delivered to their apartment in Detroit. We had a nice crib and mattress donated last week that will be a perfect fit! We will need to find or purchase bedding for the crib.

Our current needs are as follows:

- 1. Volunteers for delivery to family 2.** Must have a trailer or truck big enough to carry a full size bed.
- 2. Volunteers for a delivery to family 3.** This is a smaller delivery with just a crib and baby items.
- 3. Items:** I am trying something new and have created a registry on Amazon.com for our needed items. If you purchase from the list it will ship directly to my home for delivery to families. You can share the list if you know anyone who might like to join our efforts.

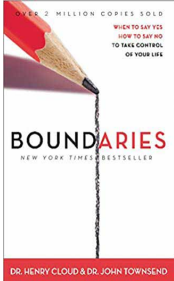
