I love nurses.

They are the embodiment of compassion and healing care. To dedicate one's time to medical training and one's life to serve others in the medical field is a high calling. Almost all of us have been on the receiving end of a nurse's mercy, because their vocation is the backbone of our country's medical services.

I recall reading of a nurse at Hurley who worked overtime to tend to COVID patients and was living in a trailer across the parking lot so that he could be more available for on call shifts. I met an Emergency Room nurse at Genesys who, for 20 years, has volunteered to take the Christmas Eve shift so that other nurses could spend it with their families. I think of the medical people in my life and in our church who are quick to share their skills and help, because it is needed and they are able.

Recently I had an outpatient procedure done. As I woke up in the recovery room I felt the fog of the anesthesia slowly lift. I also realized that I didn't have my glasses and couldn't see to the end of my bed clearly. A figure in scrubs was filling out forms. A second figure came up along side. As my brain started turning gears I heard the two talking about weight loss tips and exercise. Among several things that I began saying was, "Anyone in scrubs is beautiful." The nurse responded, "Even that guy", pointing to a rather large male nurse walking down the hallway.

"Everybody in scrubs is beautiful!"

I am glad I had anesthesia in my system. It is a great excuse when you say silly things. However silly it was, I meant it. I have a profound gratitude for anyone in scrubs. As simple as the outfit is, in itself, it has come to mean caring, serving, and compassion. This reminds me of what the Apostle Paul says we should be dressed in as a Church of Jesus followers.

Colossians 3:12-15 Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with a heart of mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if someone happens to have a complaint against anyone else. Just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also forgive others. And to all these virtues add love, which is the perfect bond. Let the peace of Christ be in control in your heart (for you were in fact called as one body to this peace), and be thankful.

What would the world look like if church folks dressed themselves in such a way? What would the reputation of Christianity be? Clearly this is part of what Paul is thinking, but it is also about how we might treat each other and go about our daily lives.

During this season of thanksgiving and holiday celebration, consider how you might put on the 'spiritual scrubs' of the virtues that Paul describes. How might this affect family gatherings? Political discussions? Neighborhood interactions?

Everyone who dresses in compassion and mercy, kindness, humility, gentleness and the like are beautiful. Not only because these are attractive traits, but because they make you look like Jesus!

ADVENT

Exodus 23: ¹⁰ "Six years you shall sow your land and gather in its yield, ¹¹ but the seventh year you shall let it rest and lie fallow so that the poor of your people may eat, and what they leave the wild animals may eat. You shall do the same with your vineyard and with your olive orchard.

¹² "Six days you shall do your work, but on the seventh day you shall rest so that your ox and your donkey may have relief and your homeborn slave and the resident alien may be refreshed. ¹³ Be attentive to all that I have said to you. Do not invoke the names of other gods; do not let them be heard on your lips."

The Worship Committee has decided to do something new with the Advent Devotional in 2022. For many years we have solicited daily devotion from the congregation and have benefited from each's reflections on the season and on God's goodness to us. This year we are feeling the need to 'rest and lie fallow'. Therefore, using the theme "Less is More", we will be engaging together in a different kind of devotional.

There are two parts. The first is a booklet that guides you through each week of Advent with different meditations and thoughts for the week. Your household is invited to use the traditional advent candles and wreath to create a moment of reflection and holy conversation. If you live alone, consider joining with another household or other individuals to make the experience more rich.

The second part is a poster that offers simple daily activities designed to encourage being present in the moment. Think of it as daily challenges to focus your heart on the incarnation of God and to be present to God's salvation in our lives.
