

PASTOR'S LETTER

End of Life, Beginning of Resurrection

It was the second time she was diagnosed with cancer. She had beaten it last time. Her energy returned and her vitality was just as it had been. But this time, this time was different. The thought of going through surgeries, chemo and radiation wasn't hopeful. It was wearying. Like a burden that would slowly crush her rather than pain that would blossom into gain.

She got a second opinion. The second doctor agreed that her condition was terminal and there was a drastically smaller chance that she would recover a second time.

She decided to walk out of the hospital instead of being carried out. She entered into a care facility and spent the next 8 months patiently waiting with her family and friends for nature to take its course.

For him, it was dialysis five days a week that was the last straw. He was exhausted by the constant procedures and tests. Every doctor's visit was a new medication to try. Every new medication was a new list of side effects and restrictions. The balance of taking care of his own medical needs and enjoying the lives of his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren was becoming seriously askew.

He was too weak to walk out of the hospital, but the next four weeks were filled with joy as he invited his family and friends into his home. He made sure that each of his family members knew they were loved, forgiven and cherished. He joked, laughed and played Euchre with anyone who happened to come by.

He was 21 when he learned he had cancer the first time. He was bitter. He raged against God. To be faced with death at such a young age was unfair. Somehow, he got through it. He was in remission and he reconciled with his God and his faith. His life was transformed. He changed careers, he got married.

His cancer came back.

This time there was very little that could be done. The choice was his to engage with every therapy available, no matter how untested, or accept his situation and make the best of it. He spent the rest of his days meeting new people, investing in relationships he already had, and writing. His last days were filled with peace and contentment. He used the time he had well.

The common denominator between these three stories is Hospice. Many of us have had to consider the options for family members and friends. A few of us have had to consider it for ourselves. There is a tendency to view Hospice as throwing the towel in and giving up. It can even be seen as an immoral choice because it is akin to suicide, giving up on life. I would like to assure you that Hospice is no such thing. Hospice is simply a switch of philosophy care that attends to the emotional and spiritual needs of the patient and does not employ curative medicine. It is a medical approach that upholds the value of kindness and promotes the dignity of the patient and their family.

Hospice is also designed for family and friends to be involved in a meaningful way with the process of death. Facing death together with a family and a community is always easier than alone. Hospice is structured to create that support for the patient, family and friends.

Hospice is also honest. We all face death. Most of us do a great job of ignoring it most days-and there are many other things to concentrate on and enjoy. But when the ultimate questions are being asked, Hospice gives us a healthy way to answer them or maybe just hold each other as we wait to find out. God is in those moments. God made us and God calls us back to himself. And while we look forward to a day without death, sickness or tears, for now, we can find great solace in the reprieve that Hospice can bring. In a manner of speaking, Hospice slows down time and allows us to consider well the moments we receive and order our steps before a loving God.


She was dying in her home. Just like she had imagined. The nurse came once a day to check how she was doing. Friends came to sit for a while. The pastor came to pray.

She was bitter at first. Used to managing her family and life, she tried to command from her bedside. It only frustrated her and annoyed her family. One day, she had an epiphany of sorts. She came to accept her circumstance. She reconciled her feelings with God. In that moment, her life changed. Peace began to exude from her. People who came into her room felt it, received it, and it was good.

It was after a few weeks in the telemetry floor that she ended up in the intensive care unit. Her heart was failing and her mind did not understand. The day came: "Code Blue!" was screamed out over the intercom. The crash cart was rushed into the room and a crowd of specialists performed their well practiced life preserving rituals. The head physician, straddling her body, applied the AED paddles again and again until finally he stopped, checked his watch and they recorded the time of death. They left her body alone lying on the gurney, crushed and deflated.

A nurse cried softly to herself after putting the phone back in its cradle. The women's son, not knowing how to grieve, refused to come and claim his mother.

She laid in bed where she had been for the past few weeks. She was having a good evening. Her pain and nausea had been managed and she had a little more energy than she had had in a while. Her son played songs from the sixties on his phone. Her daughter stood at the foot of the bed lipsyncing to Mic Jagger. They told jokes, old and new. They shared memories and dreamed dreams. Then hugged each other, told each other, "I love you," prayed together and went to bed. She was gone in the morning.



We spent an afternoon together and packaged them up. We set a goal of 300 'warm kits' and managed to package 900! It was a wonderful day of our community serving together.

This November 19th we will be partnering with Rise Against Hunger (www.riseagainsthunger. org) to package over 12,000 meals for those in need. We will meet from 4-6pm at the Fenton United Methodist Church Family Life Center. After a brief moment of worship and prayer, people of all ages will sort and pack the meals.

All are invited to participate, so please put the date on your calendar. In the meantime, please consider donating to this effort. As area churches we need to raise over \$4000 to pay for the material and bulk food supplies. One church alone would struggle with this, but together, as a community and in the power of the Holy Spirit, we can do all things! All donations can be sent to the church office.

Pathways to End Hunger

We target remote, last-mile communities within hunger pockets designated "serious" or higher on the Global Hunger Index, which are the hardest places to reach and are often difficult to access, lack communication and have poor infrastructure. With the support of our global impact partners, we practice locally-led development by providing expertise vital to empower local communities and provide meals through local schools to incentivize attendance and enable kids to obtain an education. 
2024 FFPC Budget
