PASTOR'S LETTER

Fear is the Mind Killer:

When Mission Creep becomes Mission Abandonment.

The title of this article comes from the book and movie Dune. It references the pseudo religious philosophy that is displayed throughout the story. It also is quite true. When we are afraid, we tend to lose our minds, doing things that, if we thought about it a bit more, we wouldn't have considered. Fear has a way of deconstructing our best intentions into default reactions that may or may not align with our ethics and morals.

I have been studying the story of Naaman in a personal devotion. Naaman was a commander of the army of the king of Aram; a very successful warrior and highly respected man. However, he had leprosy which was a limiting factor to his political, social, and religious life. Hearing that there was a prophet in Samaria who could cure leprosy, Naaman asks his king for permission to cross the border and seek healing. The King of Aram agreed and sent a letter to the King of Israel, requesting healing for his servant.

The interesting part of this story is the King of Israel's response. Naaman "brought the

letter to the king of Israel, which read, 'When this letter reaches you, know that I have sent to you my servant Naaman, that you may cure him of his disease.' When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, 'Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his skin disease? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me." (2 Kings 5:6-7)

On the outset the king of Israel's response seems reasonable enough. The king seems to be unaware or does not believe that a prophet in Samaria could help Naaman, although we will touch on this later. The king is very aware that the king of Aram, most likely, is insinuating a threat of violence if Naaman isn't healed. It is also unnerving to learn that a person with leprosy has come to visit. The king of Israel has a lot to be scared of. Except that there is a prophet in Israel and the king of Israel has nothing to fear.

The devastating part of this story is that the king of Israel's fearful actions were an abandonment of the mission that God

gave his people beginning with Abram. Genesis 22:18 says, "by your offspring shall all the nations of the earth gain blessing for themselves, because you have obeyed my voice." The purpose of the kingdom of Israel was, in large part, to bless the peoples around them. This was done by humbly worshiping God and faithfully obeying the law. In the story of Naaman we have the nation of Israel, which is not powerful economically or militarily, presented with an opportunity to bless their neighbor nation. Naaman was revered in his country; what a great opportunity to share God's blessing simply by acknowledging that there is a prophet in Samaria.

I believe that the king of Israel knew full well of Elisha. Reading further on, it seems clear that Elisha had a relationship with the king and communicated regularly with the royal court. Could it be that fear robbed the king of Israel of knowledge of Elisha? Either way, the king's initial reaction to Naaman and his abandonment of the God given mission of the nation of Israel has some pretty clear parallels in our own lives and the church.

We all have to deal with fear. Many times, fear is what keeps us from doing very unhealthy things. However, when fear keeps us from working out our God given mission there are problems, especially in the church. As individuals and the Body of Christ, we are called to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20).

This is a high calling and it is reasonable

to be fearful of it. In order to teach, we need to be trained. In order to baptize, we need to be commissioned. In order to go, we need to be equipped. To the extent that the fear of the mission encourages us to prepare ourselves to fulfill the mission, that is a holy fear. However, if our fear of the mission is so great that we lose our minds and begin to augment, divert or abandon our mission altogether, we cannot be the people of God that God is intending. Like a campfire within the ring, it is great for roasting hotdogs and smores. Once it grows beyond the fire ring, it is a destructive force quickly becoming unmanageable.

In what ways has fear augmented or diverted our church from the mission that Jesus has given us?

What are those fears?

How can we face them together and not give them so much power?

In what ways has fear led you to abandon Jesus' mission in your own life?

Do you have people that you can comfortably have a spiritual conversation with and talk through these fears?

Do you want people like that in your life?

How can we nurture community around us and within the church that helps us to stay on the mission that Jesus has given us?

Fear is a mind killer. May you be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. May Jesus speak the words, 'Do not be afraid', breathe peace into your heart, and may you follow faithfully.
