Keep the Main Thing the Main Thing

A friend of mine died recently. I had not seen him in 8 years and even then it was through the window of a hospital door. He had gone through a very difficult procedure. After recovering and living well for those 8 years he was overcome by complications. All in all, I hadn't had a decent conversation with him for 20 years or more.

In reading Facebook eulogies and doing my own remembering the term 'One thing' surfaced. This was a by-line used by my friend constantly. 'One Thing' was a call to focus the efforts of our lives to what God was doing in the world.

Proclaiming the Gospel with all we have, sharing God's love with our neighbors and the world, and resting confidently in our identify of being a beloved child of God. Living a life of spiritual integrity so that the reality of God's presence bubbled up through everything we did.

What struck me was that my friend has been incredibly consistent in his spiritual integrity. He ended his emails and letters with, 'One Thing'. He shared the idea so fervently that those around him shared the sentiment and took it on as a communal focal point. In a complicated, busy world, it was a call to a simplistic order of priority and identity. In what you are doing, are you living worthy of the Gospel, or not? Keep the one thing, the one thing.

I could ask you what your one thing is. However, that quickly misses the point. In the Kingdom of God there are not a plethora of 'one things'. There is only ONE, 'one thing'. As citizens of the kingdom, as slaves of Jesus, we don't get to choose our focus. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the one thing. Everything else is secondary.

Our Mission: To be a loving community of faith dedicated to helping people know Jesus Christ and grow, share, and serve as his disciples.





We think our jokes about the other side are much funnier than they really are. We take the jokes that are launched at 'us' from 'them' way too seriously. We are all wound up in a fiery maelstrom, stoked by the fearful prophesies of those who want our unquestioning loyalty and political allegiance for their own ends. Simply ignoring the news does not staunch the soul crushing fear that seems to be the currency of our times.



The Gospel is 'Good News' and all of us are in desperate need of good news. What is the good news that Jesus brings? God saves (1 Timothy 1:15). No only does God save sinners (like you and me), God is also in the business of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5:18), he is also working for the redemption of all creation (Romans 8:20-22). This is profoundly good news! God is saving, reconciling, and redeeming all things. This is the one thing.

When you watch the news tonight, remember the one thing. When you consider how to respond in social media, remember the one thing. When the Spirit nudges you to serve the poor and marginalized, remember the one thing. When dark strongholds in your mind attempt to tear you down, remember the one thing: God Saves.


The Gospel of Jesus is not something that limits us to any particular politic or ideology. The Gospel is beautifully expansive and grows us closer to the imagination of God.



Adult Education classes reconvene in September.


Here is a preview - mark your calendars!

Perhaps no other book of the Bible feels as inaccessible and as intimidating to us as the very last one. The book of Revelation overflows with images and ideas that confound our modern ears. But if all Scripture is God-breathed and profitable, we should assume Revelation is as accessible and helpful as any other book of the Bible. Why don't we see it that way?

Two thousand years ago, John's Revelation was circulated and read aloud among seven churches in Asia Minor. Those who heard the letter understood it and drew encouragement from its message. The same can be true for you today. Over 10 sessions of verse-by-verse Bible study, Jen Wilkin helps you discover how the last book of the Bible—the culmination of God's great story—speaks both a steadying word of assurance and a strong call to endure to the church in every age.





While we have much of the needed furniture for these families, we are still looking for some items and for volunteers to greet the families with welcome meals and transportation from the airport. It is really wonderful that there are now so many opportunities to get involved locally in the important work of refugee resettlement.
