Nightmare Church by Pastor Robbie Carnes



Everyday I drive by the church building I take note of what the community has written on the chalkboard on South LeRoy Street. Each month there is a thoughtful question written for response and a space to scrawl prayer requests. I try my best to pray for each thing that is written. It has become an important part of our community's spirituality and a wonderful way for our Church to be present in Fenton.

It's all good, until it isn't. Many times, the words and images draw on the blackboard become crowded and illegible. Sometimes there are nasty political references that take away from the spirit of the board and meant to cause derision. Very few times there are foul words that need to be erased immediately.

Recently, the question, "What do you expect from a Church?" was written for a response. Someone wrote underneath, "Nightmare."

My heart broke a little. I wonder if this was just another sarcastic snipe at institutional organization? I wonder what sad story lies beyond that word? I wonder what kind of Church that person was referring to? I wonder how FFPC can be experienced as a nightmare?

Don't get me wrong. I love our church. There is a gaggle of folks here who consistently give of themselves, share of their resources and love in remarkable ways. There are dedicated people who serve others and faithfully lead ministries and worship services. There is a lot of God's light shining.

But you know that sometimes there isn't enough of that warming light to go around. Someone gets left out. Someone gets snubbed. A word is spoken that shouldn't have. A false story is spun based on incomplete facts. A motive is questioned, a reputation is tarnished, forgiveness is withheld, relationships are broken. A cloud of negativity settles in and gripe sessions are scheduled.

Hello & Welcome

The Church is not a building. It is a gathering of people brought together to experience God's love and purpose.

God designed the church for YOU – you belong here. Are you ready to experience a community of people doing life together? To find out, come worship with us on Sunday mornings.

Thank you for worshipping with us! We are happy to welcome you into this household of God. We all know that this happens, we all have participated in it one way or another, and we all received our personalized invitation for the upcoming nightmare event.

How do we not be a nightmare church? How do we keep from slipping off Jesus' narrow road into that deep and wide ditch? I believe that we are tempted to simply ignore the issues and carry on. Someone gets hurt at church and we encourage them, but its too little too late and they quietly shift into the margins. There isn't a healthy way to air all of the dirty laundry without causing more of a stir. Let's bury it, grin, and bear it. If we wait long enough, until the pain is forgotten or the hurtful people have left or new people come in and bring some change, we will get through it.

I do not believe this is the way Jesus teaches in his words or actions. In fact, I believe that the act of ignoring our nightmare is also an act of ignoring what Jesus has accomplished on the cross. Jesus died and was resurrected so that we, ourselves, might be reconciled with God. We are also given the ministry of reconciliation to be reconciled with each other and to encourage everyone to be reconciled to God (2 Corinthians 5:18-20). To ignore this role of our faith in our church community is like Superman fighting the bad guys and forgetting that he can fly.

We combat the tendency of being a nightmare church by seeking to be reconciled with each other. This is hard, spiritual work. It means that we need to be quick to forgive and eager to be forgiven. It means that we need be honest with our feelings; sorting out what the real problem is before we confront the wrong person about the wrong subject. It means that we value our words and strive to lift everyone up as positively as we can. Loose (negative) lips can sink the Church ship. We can not take full responsibility of our words and actions if we haven't done the introspective work of discerning what belongs to us and what belongs to the other.

This doesn't mean that we ignore or whitewash bad behavior. It doesn't mean that we aren't allowed to express contradictory thoughts, beliefs, or feelings. It does mean that we speak the truth in Love (Ephesians 4:15). Here are five crucial points about this verse:

- 1. Speak. If you choose to remain silent, you need to let the issue go. It is dishonest to harp about an injury when you are not looking to resolve it. You are simply picking the scab and not allowing it to heal.
- 2. The Truth. Make sure that you are speaking what is true and relates correctly with facts. Ask for clarification. Make room in your perception for other people's views and ideas. Give yourself space to be wrong and allow for correction. I suffer from the perverse belief that I can read minds. When I try to read minds, I suffer.
- 3.Love. Do you want to remain in relationship with this other person? If so, temper your words. Be honestly gentle. Don't burn the bridge with arrogance, pride, or ill timed jokes.
- 4. Discipline. 'Loving TruthSpeak' is the action of one disciple of Jesus to another. However, we cannot discipline those we do not have a relationship with. Ranging from ineffective to abusive, seeking to discipline without a relationship is perceived as judgmental and prone to drive people away. We need to invest in relationship before we can share our helpful comments for everyday living. If we have a relationship with another, the goal of discipline is to restore a healthy relationship with Jesus and with the other.
- 5. Health. Striving for healthy relationships and resolving harmful situations can, at times, cause rifts in relationship. Healthy boundaries are necessary and we shouldn't be surprised when harmful people challenge those boundaries and tax our support networks. As Followers of Jesus, we look to be as healthy as we can toward God, ourselves, and others. We also look for the overall health of our church and community. Sometimes that means we need to exclude others. This is in order to resolve the nightmare rather than to be a nightmare.

Jesus came to seek the lost and to save the Nightmare Church. Our Church is made up of sinful humans and we will always find ways to hurt each other. Praise God that through the Power of the Holy Spirit we can seek what was lost by our bad behavior and ill advised words and be reconciled with each other because we have been reconciled with Christ. Let's wake up from the nightmare friends.

Big Picture Question: Does God keep God's promises? God always keeps God's promises because God is faithful.


