Gift Options

Your gift-giving can benefit children in Samaritas' Foster Care, Family Preservation, Affordable Living, and/or New Americans services.

Ways to Give:

- Sign up to receive a wish list written by a child in Foster Care, Family Preservation, or Affordable Living. Wish lists will go out to donors beginning in early November. Gifts are due in early to mid-December (dates vary by program).
- Donate individual toys to refugee children resettled through Samaritas' New Americans program.
- Collect gift cards (\$25 & \$50) that will be used to purchase Christmas gifts for children who enter care close to the holidays.

Please drop your gift/toy off at the church office. Donations can be made to the church with Samaritas Christmas in the memo line.
