Hello & Welcome

There is a documented phenomenon that most of us experience called the 'illusion of transparency'. This refers to our tendency to believe that our interior thoughts and emotions are clearly displayed on our face and through our words and actions. This can produce two difficulties in interpersonal relationships.

The first is that we assume that our emotions and feelings are being discerned by those around us. Do you wear your heart on your sleeve? Are you an open book? While some people are better at expressing emotions than others, it is clear that most of us assume our emotions are being communicated better than they actually are. This means that we choose to not share our emotions with others because we think they already know, when, in fact, they have no idea what we are feeling.

Can you imagine how this might lead to chaotic relationships and perceptions of being 'prickly'? The people around you may be experiencing you as a volatile friend if you are acting out of emotions that they are not aware of. You might be very unpredictable if your choices about entertainment, food or other activities are based on hidden emotions. The lack of clarity around your feelings might push people away because they don't know what they are dealing with.

The second issue that we might be communicating emotions, but not the ones we are actually feeling. When I was a little boy, there was a man in our church whose resting face was a frown. I am not sure why this was, but I assumed that he didn't like me very much because he frowned at me all the time. Boy was I surprised when the man smiled! Clearly his frown was not communicating the emotions he was feeling inside.

Clarity around the quality and intensity of emotions is very important. Incorrectly assuming an emotion for someone else might do more harm than missing the emotion completely. A multitude of manipulative, enabling and defensive behavior can be avoided sending clear emotional signals.

The challenge with the illusion of transparency is that we may not even know that we are doing it. Therefore, the way to counter this negative tendency is to learn to be clear about our emotions with others.

Is it ok for you to share how you are feeling with others?

Can you do it without oversharing?

Can you share how you are feeling without making excuses?

A lot of the learning necessary for this type of growth is language. How do we say certain things without doing more harm than good? One step is to spend time reflecting on how we are feeling and then putting it in the right wording. Are you joyful? Are you depressed? Are you struggling? Being specific with how we are feeling can help us choose the right words to share with others.

One powerful step toward expressing our emotions in healthy ways is that of expressing gratitude in clear ways. Most people react very positively when receiving gratitude and it can be good practice for our hearts when the time comes for sharing negative feelings. A study that is referenced above studied the reaction of letters of gratitude to important people in their lives and compared the writers' expectations and the recipient's reactions. In a reflection of the illusion of transparency, it was found that the recipients were more surprised and pleased at the kind words than the writers expected. The writers also assumed that the other person already knew how grateful they were.

Most of us do not need a scientific study to prove to us that thank cards are important and have a positive impact. Proverbs 16:24 says "Pleasant words are as a honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones." We can have a great impact on the people we care about, work with and live with by simply saying thank you in as many ways as we can.

What is curious to me is that we assume that people already know we are grateful or that our words of gratitude aren't important. If you just read that sentence and thought that it didn't apply to you please reflect on when you wrote a thank you note last. Gratitude is shown best by action and not intention.

Who can you be grateful to today? How can you best express that? (Body language is a start, but words bring the best clarity)

Are there other emotions that you need to share with others, simply so that they can understand and be more comfortable around you? Could it be that identifying the emotions that we carry with us and sharing them in healthy ways with others can decrease our personal tendencies of toxicity and narcissism? A thank you card might be a great way to start.



First the arrivals... three families and 3 individuals have arrived so far this month. Two more individuals should arrive this week. Almost all of the arrivals are coming to Michigan from tropical climes, and our cold is a challenge! Luckily, they have all been referred to Crossover Ministries in Flint to receive winter clothing. Volunteers are needed to provide transportation to and from Crossover. Please let me know if you have availability to provide a ride. Additionally, we have nearly emptied our storage room in our efforts to outfit the new apartments. We are and need of the following:

- Twin and full size sheets
- Twin and full size comforters
- Kitchen towels
- Bath towels
- Sets of silverware
- Kitchen utensils

All donations can be dropped off at First Presbyterian Church Monday through Thursday between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. or you can contact me to drop off at a different time.

We have a new community partner! Thank you to our neighbors at St Jude's for providing these wonderful basic needs bags to all of the new arrivals! Each bag is filled with toiletries, paper products, and cleaning products that will be a wonderful addition to our deliveries.



Now to introduce our newest project! Last week we began offering English classes; 21 students and five volunteers were there for the kickoff! The need for this service is immense, and we are grateful to everyone who is making it possible: Brian, our ESL teacher, all of the volunteers, and El Shaddai Church for generously providing transportation and the meeting space.
