¹ A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. ² The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him - the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding, the Spirit of counsel and of might, the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the Lord - ³ and he will delight in the fear of the Lord. He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; ⁴ but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give

NEW TESTAMENT LESSON: Ephesians 4:1-13

⁴ I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, ² with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, ³ making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling, ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism, ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is above all and through all and in all. ⁷ But each of us was given grace according to the measure of Christ's gift. ⁸ Therefore it is said, "When he ascended on high he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people." ⁹ (When it says, "He ascended," what does it mean but that he had also descended[a] into the lower parts of the earth? ¹⁰ He who descended is the same one who ascended far above all the heavens, so that he might fill all things.) ¹¹ The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³ until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ.

SERMON "The Gifts of the Spirit"

RESPONDING TO THE WORD

HYMN #233 The Day of Resurrection

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH From the Heidelberg Catechism

Q 72. Does this outward washing with water itself wash away sins?

A. No, only Jesus Christ's blood and the Holy Spirit cleanse us from all sins.

Q 73. Why then does the Holy Spirit call baptism the water of rebirth and the washing away of sins?

A. God has good reason for these words. To begin with, God wants to teach us that the blood and Spirit of Christ take away our sins just as water removes dirt from the body. But more important, God wants to assure us, by this divine pledge and sign, that we are as truly washed of our sins spiritually as our bodies are washed with water physically.

Q74 . Should infants also be baptized?

A. Yes. Infants as well as adults are included in God's covenant and people, and they, no less than adults, are promised deliverance from sin through Christ's blood and the Holy Spirit who produces faith. Therefore, by baptism, the sign of the covenant, they too should be incorporated into the Christian church and distinguished from the children of unbelievers. This was done in the Old Testament by circumcision, which was replaced in the New Testament by baptism.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Dear God, you are our refuge and our strength; you are an ever present help in our troubles. Teach us to not fear, even though our world is changing, even though we feel our foundations trembling and waters that were calm long ago are roaring and foaming.

Make war cease to the ends of the earth, break our weapons, dull our sharpened edges, burn our defensive posturing down around us. Teach us to be still and know that you are God. Exalt yourself among the nations, be exalted in the earth! May you be our only refuge, O Lord of Hosts be with us.

May we be a community in which you dwell. May we be a church which is fed by your Spirit, your holy habitation. May we encourage each other to good works and holy living. May we build each other up and bear each other's burden. May we be your holy and beloved people, clothed with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience. And may your Kingdom grow so that all are counted as holy and beloved.
